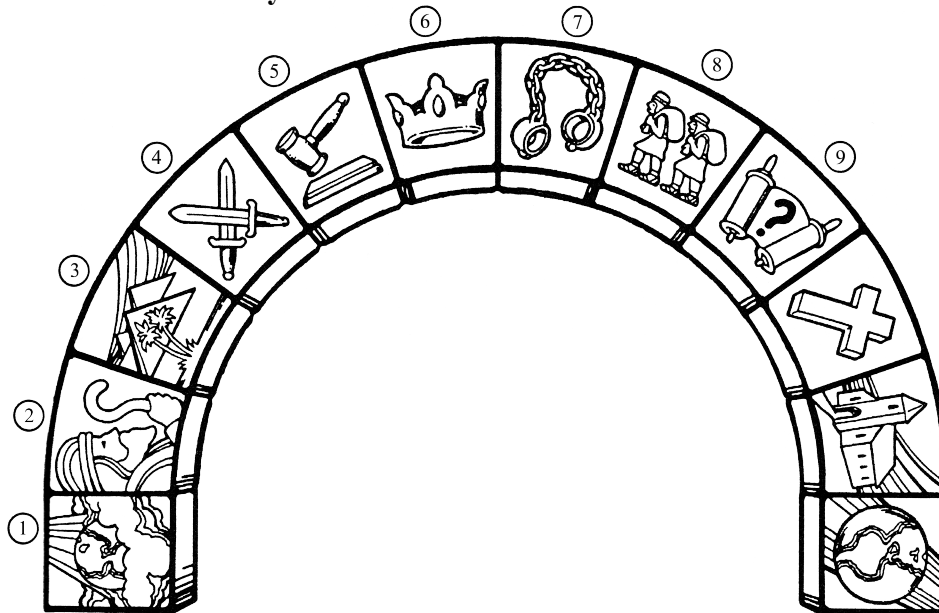

#### Nine Main Eras of the Old Testament

1. \_\_\_\_\_  
The *creation* of the world and man, and early events.
2. \_\_\_\_\_  
The birth of the Hebrew people through a family of *patriarchs*, covering a period of two hundred years.
3. \_\_\_\_\_  
The *exodus* of the Hebrew people as they were delivered out of four hundred years of slavery in Egypt.
4. \_\_\_\_\_  
The *conquest* of the Promised Land by the Hebrew people upon their return from Egypt.
5. \_\_\_\_\_  
A four-hundred year period during which Israel is governed by rulers called *judges*.
6. \_\_\_\_\_  
An additional four-hundred year period during which Israel becomes a full-fledged nation ruled by a *monarchy*.
7. \_\_\_\_\_  
A seventy-year period during which Israel's leaders live in *exile*, having been conquered by foreign countries.
8. \_\_\_\_\_  
The *return* of exiled Jews to Jerusalem to rebuild the city and the temple.
9. \_\_\_\_\_  
A final four-hundred year period between the close of the Old Testament and the opening of the New Testament.

4. Conquest	_____	The leader of Israel's army
5. Judges	_____	The most famous judge
6. Kingdom	_____	The most well-known Israelite king
7. Exile	_____	The major exilic prophet
8. Return	_____	The central return leader
9. Silence	_____	The religious leaders

### Nine Main Locations of the Old Testament

<i>ERA:</i>	<i>FIGURE:</i>	<i>LOCATION:</i>	<i>DESCRIPTION:</i>
1. Creation	Adam	_____	The garden of Eden, where Adam is created. Near the convergence of the Tigris and Euphrates.
2. Patriarch	Abraham	_____	Abraham migrates from Ur, near Eden, to Canaan, where he and the other patriarchs live until the time of slavery in Egypt.



3. Exodus	Moses	_____	During a severe famine, the Israelites migrate to Egypt and are enslaved four hundred years before the exodus to freedom.
4. Conquest	Joshua	_____	Joshua leads the conquest of the Promised Land in Canaan.
5. Judges	Samson	_____	The Israelites live in Canaan under a loose tribal system ruled by judges for the next four hundred years.
6. Kingdom	David	_____	With the formation of a formal monarchy, the land is now referred to by the national name of Israel.
7. Exile	Daniel	_____	Because of judgment for national moral corruption, Israel is conquered by foreign nations, finally forcing her leaders into seventy years exile in Babylonia.
8. Return	Ezra	_____	The exiled Israelites are allowed to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the city and temple, though they remain under the dominion of Persia.
9. Silence	Pharisees	_____	Though dominion of the land changes from Persia to Greece to Rome, Israel is allowed to worship in Jerusalem without disruption for the next four hundred years of "silence."
