



ERA: 1. Creation	FIGURE:	DESCRIPTION: The first man
2. Patriarch		The first patriarch
3. Exodus		The leader of the exodus
4. Conquest		The leader of Israel's army
5. Judges		The most famous judge
6. Kingdom		The most well-known Israelite king
7. Exile		The major exilic prophet
8. Return		The central return leader
9. Silence		The religious leaders

## **Nine Main Locations of the Old Testament**

ERA: 1. Creation	FIGURE: Adam	LOCATION:	DESCRIPTION: The garden of Eden, where Adam is created. Near the convergence of the Tigris and Euphrates.
2. Patriarch	Abraham		Abraham migrates from Ur, near Eden, to Canaan, where he and the other patriarchs live until the time of slavery in Egypt.



3. Exodus	Moses	During a severe famine, the Israelites migrate to Egypt and are enslaved four hundred years before the exodus to freedom.
<ul><li>4. Conquest</li><li>5. Judges</li></ul>	Joshua Samson	Joshua leads the conquest of the Promised Land in Canaan. The Israelites live in Canaan under a loose tribal system ruled by judges for the next four hundred years.
6. Kingdom	David	 With the formation of a formal monarchy, the land is now referred to by the national name of Israel.
7. Exile	Daniel	Because of judgment for national moral corruption, Israel is conquered by foreign nations, finally forcing her leaders into seventy years exile in Babylonia.
8. Return	Ezra	 The exiled Israelites are allowed to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the city and temple, though they remain under the dominion of Persia.
9. Silence	Pharisees	Though dominion of the land changes from Persia to Greece to Rome, Israel is allowed to worship in Jerusalem without disruption for the next four hundred years of "silence."
